READING: GENESIS 1:1, 20-28

R: A reading from, the book of Genesis, the 1st Chapter.

¹ In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

²⁰ God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky." ²¹ So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. ²² God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." ²³ And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

²⁴ And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind." And it was so. ²⁵ God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind and the cattle of every kind and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶ Then God said, "Let us make humans in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over the cattle and over all the wild animals of the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."

²⁷ So humans were created in God's image, in the image of God they were created; male and female God created them.

²⁸ God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and steward it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."




